Dear Participant:

Every year the Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Illinois (BCBSIL) revises its prescription drug formulary. The prescription drug formulary is the list of pharmaceutical substances previously provided to you by BCBSIL. The amount of your co-pay will depend on whether you purchase a generic drug, a formulary brand-name drug, or a non-formulary brand-name drug. The difference between a formulary and non-formulary brand-name drug is whether or not the brand-name drug is on your BCBSIL formulary list.

The chart below shows the three categories, or tiers, that apply to prescription medications and the amount of your co-pay for each tier:

Most of the brand-name medications moved to Tier III because a generic version of the medication is now available. **Please note that only the formulary has changed, the benefits available to you remain the same.**

Also, please read the attached illustration on how to save money on your prescription medications and speak to your physician about using one of the generic or formulary brand-name alternatives in order to obtain the maximum value of your benefit.
